So the Next Generation Might Know...

There is a great need at this present time in our culture for Christian men to understand God's revelation and His vision for their leadership in His Kingdom. In Psalm 78:1-8, God reveals this vision, calling for His people to listen and incline their ears to His instruction and the words of His mouth, and then to teach the next generation so that they will know and trust in God. This is God's vision that men must embrace: listen to know and teach to make known! Ultimately, knowing is trusting, holding fast, and obeying faithfully.

God explains the importance and the greatness of the vision: "...that the generation to come might know, even the children yet born, that they may arise and tell them to their children, that they should put their confidence in God and not forget the works of God, but keep His commandments, and not be like their fathers, a stubborn and rebellious generation, a generation that did not prepare its heart and whose spirit was not faithful to God" (Psalm 78:6-8). To this vision, men are being called, and men are responding!

Rattling the Chains

Jesus said, "If the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed" (Jn. 8:36). But, this freedom is not to live how one wants to live. Paul addressed this in Romans 6. Paul asked, "Are we to continue in sin so that grace may increase?" (6:1). His simple reply, "May it never be!" (6:2). Paul explained that we are no longer slaves to sin (6:6), and sin is no longer master over us (6:14). The chains have been broken. Therefore, believers are to affirm who they are in Christ Jesus - "dead to sin" and "alive to God" (6:11). They are not to let the tyrant king of sin reign in their mortal bodies (6:12). Nor are they to present the members of their bodies to sin as instruments of unrighteousness, but to God as instruments of righteousness (6:13). Freedom in Christ means to "walk in newness of life" (6:4). Satan does not want the children of God to believe this truth. The father of lies rattles the chains of sin's captivity in order to deceive and convince us that we are still in bondage. You are free in Christ! Stand firm in your faith. Affirm who you are in Christ -- Dead to sin! Alive to God! -and resist the devil. Rise up, men of God.
