

The first official Men of Simplicity (MOS) meetings were a huge success! There were 23 men in attendance on Zoom at the Sunday night group with Open Door Baptist Church. On Monday night, a total of 97 men from nine different churches/groups were in attendance. 49 of those meeting in small groups in six different locations connecting via Zoom and 71 guys joining individually from their homes on Zoom. That means 120 men were able to hear Mike Thibodeaux's first message called "A Man's Ambition." This message, taken from 2 Corinthians 5:6-10, focuses on the truth that the ambition of ambassadors for Christ is to be pleasing to Him. Mike challenged the men with these questions: "Do you have godly ambition?" and "What degree of difficulty are you willing to endure to live a life that is pleasing (acceptable) to the Lord?"

The message is timely. Circumstances during our launch and first month of MOS included the coronavirus pandemic and widespread local wildfires. Because of the fires and evacuations, four of the six men in the Estacada MOS group were unable to attend the first meeting. Gathering as the church has been difficult and remains so. But, we press on! We are using the technological tools we have available to continue the weekly discipling and equipping process of 139 men (total enrolled) to live simply and purely devoted to Christ. Mike is eager to resume his traveling preaching ministry, but until then, faithfully preaches through other means. We appreciate your prayers for our ministry.

Intern Perspective: One Step at a Time

Men of Simplicity (MOS) just launched with 120 men attending the first meeting. MOS is a massive project that takes so much organization, follow-up, and preparation. At times, the amount of work to be done can feel overwhelming. But around here, I'm learning that a task like this can be accomplished if it is done one step at a time. Our to-do list is divided and sub-divided into the many, smaller tasks that it takes to finish the main job. One of those smaller tasks by itself might seem unimportant, but unless it gets checked off, it is impossi-

ble to call the larger, main job complete.

I was thinking this week that this concept applies to our walk as believers. God's goal for each of us is that we grow to be more and more like Christ. That is one overwhelming task! However, our Heavenly Father does not ask us to do this all at once. Rather, He calls us to go one step further each day. He asks us for one new step of obedience. One step outside of our comfort zone. One more step in the race "for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 3:14) By themselves, these steps may seem insignificant or unimportant. But God sees how each small step is bringing us closer to the finish line.
